Postpone non-urgent surgical procedures until the patient is determined to be non-infectious or not infected. If respiratory support is indicated, then planning ahead may avoid the need for rescue interventions (e.g., crash intubations), which have greater potential for infectious transmission due to mishaps during the use of barrier protections.

The checklist serves to remind the surgical team of important items to be performed before and after the surgical procedure in order to reduce adverse events such as surgical site infections or retained instruments.

Retained Surgical Item (RSI) is the preferred term rather than retained foreign body or object or uRFO. Foreign objects include swallowed pennies, pins, shrapnel, bullets and other objects while surgical items are the tools and materiel that we use in procedures to heal not to harm. Retained surgical items are a surgical patient safety problem.
