Most people receive a combination of treatments for cutaneous T-cell lymphoma. Treatment options may include: Skin creams and ointments. Medicines can be applied to your skin in the form of creams, gels and ointments. Corticosteroids can help control skin redness and itchiness. Chemotherapy can be applied to the skin to attack cancer cells.

Radiation therapy uses powerful energy beams, such as X-rays and protons, to kill cancer cells. Radiation therapy can be used alone to treat cutaneous lymphoma, or it may be used after surgery to kill any cancer cells that remain. Chemotherapy. The type of cutaneous T-cell lymphoma you have helps determine which treatments are best for you. Primary cutaneous peripheral T-cell lymphoma, rare subtypes Primary cutaneous gamma/delta T-cell lymphoma tends to grow and spread very quickly. It is treated with systemic chemotherapy using a combination of drugs, but even with treatment it can be hard to control.

Treatment for Specific Types of Skin Lymphoma

Treatment for T-cell skin lymphoma that has spread is more extensive and can include immunotherapy, which kills lymphoma cells and boosts the body's immune response against other lymphoma cells, and chemotherapy that's injected or taken in pill form and often requires several clinic visits, anywhere from three to four weeks apart.

Systemic treatments may include: a chemotherapy combination called CHOP, which includes cyclophosphamide, hydroxydoxorubicin, vincristine, and prednisone newer chemo drugs, such as pralatrexate...

Primary cutaneous anaplastic large cell lymphoma (C-ALCL) typically presents as one or a few lesions on the skin that are generally larger than those of LyP and do not typically go away without treatment, although in some cases they can. CTCL can also involve the blood, lymph nodes, and other internal organs. Symptoms can include dry skin, itching (which can be severe), a red rash, and enlarged lymph nodes.

The lymphoma might show up as more than one type of lesion and on different parts of the skin (often in areas not exposed to the sun). Some skin lymphomas appear as a rash over some or most of the body (known as erythroderma).

Signs and Symptoms of Skin Lymphoma

Treatment of cutaneous lymphoma depends upon the extent of the dog's disease. Single lesions can be removed surgically or may be treated with radiation therapy.
